

Homework #2

This assignment is to design your own WWW home page. Page layout is up to each individual; however, information to appear on the page should include:

- a. Title
- b. Your name
- c. Your picture(s)
- d. A good introduction of yourself
- e. Others

Note: You must have tables and graphics in your home page. Other HTML features such as sounds, videos, animation, etc. are optional.

This homework is due February 16, 2011, before 11:00pm. You may have as many web pages as you like for your home page design. However, your first web page must be named **index.html**. For this homework submission, you need not submit any linked files, just your **index.html** and the URL of your home page. Submit them in two separate files named **index.html** and **url.txt** respectively. **url.txt** contains nothing but the URL of your first web page. Don't place anything else in this URL file. You may submit these two files either via the instructor's Web page or by accessing the following URL. Please don't hand in any assignment by email.

Note: You must code your homepage in XHTML. Use of a Web authoring tool is by no means allowed. Use of CSS is not required for this assignment. However, it will be a good idea that you use some CSS features in this assignment. Also, you may submit a **readme.txt** file if you have some points to make and would like the grader to be aware of them.

An account will be created on *lamp.cse.fau.edu* for each student in this course. You may create your homepage either on this departmental server, or on other system you have access to. In either case you need to give the full URL for you homepage in your **url.txt** file.

Some key points:

The purpose of the assignment is to show your knowledge of XHTML (including some advanced techniques) by creating and designing your own home page. Things to be checked during grading include:

- Are there two files submitted: **index.html** and **url.txt**?
- Is there a title on the page?
- Is your name on the page?
- Is your picture on the page?
- Is there a 'good' introduction of yourself?
- Do you have at least a table and other inline/linked images?

Note: The above are basic requirements for a passing grade. The more work you put in to the page the higher the number of possible points you can obtain.
